## THE ARROWGRAMS PRESERVED

Forty years ago or more somebody, probably David Stuart or Donald Van Luven, decided that an effort should be made to collect a run of the parlor bulletin, the Arrowgrams. Nobody knows for sure when publication began, but the earliest date found so far is June 1937, which just happened to have been our fiftieth anniversary. That is the only issue found for 1937. Seven were recovered for 1938, and nearly all have been collected for 1939 and thereafter.

Now coming up on its 74th year, this publication constitutes a treasure trove of information, something that genealogists can really appreciate. Initiates are listed with their birth dates, birth places and occupations. There often is information on members and their families, such as births, deaths, marriages, obituaries and biographies, together with updates on their current social activities.

Of course, access to the information is difficult: there is only one set of bulletins and there is no way of knowing what is in them without going through them all, one at a time. To overcome these problems, a project has been underway to copy the entire collection. They are being scanned with a machine that has OCR (Optical Character Recognition) capabilities, which allows one to do a word search through the entire collection.

Thus far, the interiors for the years 1937 to 1959 have been scanned using a Fujitsu Scan Snap, which scans black and white text quickly, but is not good with colors. Since most of our early issues have colorful covers, these have to be scanned separately. The years 1937 to 1941 have been completely scanned, including the covers, and printed out. The print process is tedious, and, since a hard copy is not necessary for finding information, may not be continued (unless a volunteer comes along). At a later date, a compact disc (or discs) will be provided to the parlor.

Also in attendance at the 134th session, will be Chris Leon, Former Grand officer, and Chairman of the Board of Control, attending his 13th Grand Parlor.

## ARROWHEAD PARLOR #110 ENDORSES GRAND PARLOR RESOLUTIONS

For the first time in many decades, Arrowhead Parlor No. 110 has offered and endorsed a pair of Resolutions for Grand Parlor. The Resolutions, aimed at increasing the inclusiveness and historical accuracy of the initiation ritual, have attracted support from the officers of our Parlor as well as Past Grand Presidents from parlors throughout the state. Last month the entire parlor voted to endorse both Resolutions.

The first Resolution would eliminate the masculine gender bias in the ritual, which has not been amended since the 78th Session of Grand Parlor held in San Bernardino in May, 1955, before women were allowed and encouraged to become Members. The term "member" would be substituted for "brother" in the ritual.

The second Resolution would eliminate reference to the historically inaccurate "people of the Moctezumas" and our Bear Flag as a symbol of the defeat of Mexico. The ritual would instead celebrate our shared California heritage including Pioneers, Native Americans and people of Mexican descent.

The Resolutions will be debated and voted on at Grand Parlor in Lake Tahoe in May. The Resolutions were authored by Grand Trustee candidate Tim Prince as an effort to increase membership outreach and thereby secure the future growth and survival of our Order. Since some parlors lack the diversity we enjoy at Arrowhead Parlor, our elected delegates need to spread the word that the growth of Arrowhead Parlor is based on our ability to attract young people, people of Mexican descent and women. The Resolutions can only enhance our ability to reach out to women and people of Mexican descent.

## GRAND PRESIDENT'S NIGHT

On Saturday evening, April 16th, the seven San Francisco Parlors and Past President's Association will honor our Grand President Jim Shadle, Georgetown Parlor #91. 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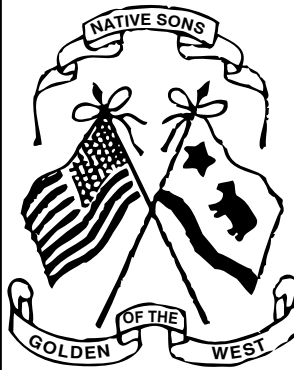
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
