RICHARD S. KIMBALL... RENAISSANCE GRAND PRESIDENT

The dictionary defines a renaissance man as one "who has broad intellectual interests and is accomplished in areas of both the arts and the sciences." A modern day example of a "renaissance man" would be Richard Kimball (GP 2003-2004), who's Grand Presidency came as a climax to a time when Arrowhead Parlor 110 had three members in state offices. Kimball was Grand Third Vice President in 200-01 when Clare McCullough was Grand President and Chris Leon was Grand Marshal.

Born in Petaluma, Kimball is a third generation Californian with historic connections to the very beginning of California as a State. He earned an AA degree in Liberal Arts from American River College, a BA in Government with a minor in philosophy and Masters from California State University, Sacramento. He also received the annual distinguished service award at CSUS.

Kimball was an honor graduate of the Army Defense Information School and served as a Senior Information Specialist with the 52nd Artillery Group in Vietnam. As a journalist he worked for the San Bernardino Sun for 34 years and became an award winning editorial page editor, writing a majority of the papers editorials for 25 years. He was a lay minister for his church and was involved with the Salvation Army, VFW, Vietnam Veterans of America, the Elks Lodge and the San Bernardino Historical and Pioneer Society. He was also a co-author of "Native Sons of the Golden West" from the "Images of America" series of books by Arcadia Publishing.

His passion for California and it's wonderful history can be seen in a September 9, 2000 Admission day editorial he wrote, noting "It doesn't necessarily have to be a day when businesses close, but, like Flag Day, it should be a time when civic organizations and schools make a special effort to use it as an excuse to teach about our rich historical heritage." Kimball was married to Barbara (Arrowhead Parlor 110) and had two children Elizabeth and Arthur.

He brought his love of California and his renaissance spirit to the office of Grand President. He rallied against an introspective order calling for an infusion of "new blood" and challenged the existing membership in his Presidential report in the

127th Proceedings to "genuinely nurture the capabilities and the skills of our own members who have not yet had opportunities to show forth their full potential" and to "constantly strive to find ways to work in tandem with the many other organizations that are committed to the preservation of California's history."

Setting the standard, Kimball's itinerary reflects that, among other things, he attended a professional fundraising seminar, three meetings of the Conference of California Historical Societies and volunteered for bay area Public radio station KQED. His term was identified with improvements in the NSGW website and increased news releases to newspapers and broadcasting stations.

In his report he offered this final encouragement to the order, "With all the talent and with all the enthusiasm that lies waiting for us to turn to our advantage, how can we go wrong?"

Sadly, on March 24, 2010 renaissance man, Grand President Richard Spear Kimball passed away, leaving a void in the order that may never be filled.

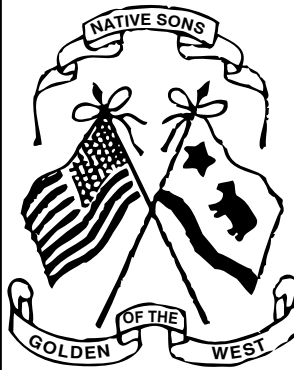
