ENDORSED GRAND PARLOR RESOLUTIONS BY ARROWHEAD PARLOR #110

The following two resolutions were endorsed by Arrowhead Parlor #110:
RESOLUTION #2

AMENDING THE RITUAL OF THE THE NATIVE SONS OF THE GOLDEN WEST TO CELEBRATE THE CULTURAL HERITAGE OF ALL CALIFORNIANS

WHEREAS the Native Sons of the Golden West celebrates the rich diversity of California, including natives whose ancestors came from all countries and continents to make California their home, and WHEREAS the earliest membership rolls of the Native Sons of the Golden West are dotted with Hispanic surnames, but the membership of the Grand Parlor and Subordinate Parlors do not fully reflect the diversity of California, and WHEREAS the Native Sons of the Golden West seeks to vigorously extinguish any vestige of exclusionary policies of times gone by which are targeted at any ethnicity. As time has progressed, those policies have long since been succeeded by forward-looking, all-embracing ones; and WHEREAS in the initiation Ritual of the Native Sons of the Golden West, the President currently refers to the Bear Flag as a "declaration and prophesy of the freedom of California from Mexican rule(page 78)..."and as "marking the passing in California of Mexican rule(page 80); and WHEREAS many members of the Native Sons of the Golden West are justifiably proud of their Mexican and Indian heritage and culture, which serves as a common bond of heritage along with the traditions and cultural ancestry of all Americans; NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED that the ritual of the Native Sons of the Golden West is amended to delete the phrase "from Mexican rule"(page 78) and replace the paragraph spoken by the President on Page 80 with the following: "Let us ever be mindful that California's proud indigenous people, Native Americans and descendants of the Mexica, lived in luxury in a luxurious land. Standing by the Pacific, they heard, mingled with the music of its waves the advancing footsteps of the Pioneers, who came to share this heritage - California, with her fruits and flowers, her ripening grains, her pine-clad mountains, her golden sands and balmy skies, her myriad fountains of wealth flowing into the sea of commerce and trade"

RESOLUTION #3

AMENDING THE RITUAL OF THE NATIVE SONS OF THE GOLDEN WEST TO INCLUDE ALL MEMBERS

WHEREAS the Ritual of the Native Sons of the Golden West was adopted at the 44th Session of the Grand Parlor held in Stockton in April 1921, and was last amended at the 78th Session held in San Bernardino in May 1955, before women were allowed and encouraged to become Members, and WHEREAS the Native Sons of the Golden West seeks to include and appeal to all California natives, regardless of gender, and avoid even the appearance of adherence to the exclusionary policies of times gone by; and WHEREAS the Constitution and Laws of the Grand Parlor and the Constitution for the Government of Subordinate Parlors appropriately use the term "member" in most all instances instead of the masculine term "Brother". and WHEREAS the Ritual of the Native Sons of the Golden West currently uses the masculine term "Brother" instead of the more inclusive and accurate term "Member", NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED that the ritual of the Native Sons of the Golden West is amended to substitute "Member(s) in place of "Brother(s)" and "My Brother(s)."

134TH GRAND PARLOR

Delegates will consider at least three resolutions and the 2011-2012 budget, and elect officers for the coming term, after which Grand 1st VP Dave Allen will ascend to the office of Grand President.

MARK SHEPHERD EULOGY *by Tim Prince*

On Wednesday, May 4th, Chair Mark Rod Shepherd died at home in Redlands on Sunday afternoon, April 17, 2011 at the age of 57 of natural causes. He leaves behind his Brother Scott Shepherd.

Mark Rod Shepherd was born on December 5, 1953 in Fresno, California to parents Marion Rod Shepherd and Naomi Josephine Shepherd. Along with his older brother Scott Lawrence, the family moved from Reedly, California to Rialto, California in 1955 where Marion began a 30 plus year association with San Bernardino Valley College (SBVC) as a speech and communications professor. Mark attended grades K through 6 at Lida M. Henry Elementary school and finished grades 7 through 9 at Frisbee Junior High School where he played Junior Varsity Football, and graduated from Eisenhower High School where he was on the tennis team. Colleges attended included SBVC as well as Chapman College in Orange, California, where he earned his Bachelor's degree. It was there that his early sparks of the love for politics and the workings of government were kindled through participation in both the Semester at Sea and World Campus Afloat programs.

Mark's jobs included six years working as a staffer for Congressman Joe Baca of the 41st Congressional District. He was currently hosting The Political Hour show on KCAA Radio in San Bernardino, where he interviewed numerous legislators, mayors, and other public officials and activists. He also chaired the San Bernardino County Democratic Central Committee from 2003 to 2006, seeing it grow and move to the large headquarters it enjoys today. He also was President of the Redlands Area Democratic Club and served for many years as Trustee of the San Bernardino Democratic Club. He was always seen at the State Democratic Conventions and was a gifted Master of Ceremonies and helped organize many local political fundraisers. He also loved rock and roll music, and once worked in concert management and attended as many concerts as he could. A relentless advocate for peace, Mark is truly resting in peace after a lifetime of helping so many people, organizations and causes, especially the Democratic Party.

At the time of his death, he was serving as 2nd Vice President of Arrowhead Parlor #110, Native Sons of the Golden West.

A celebration of the Life of Mark Rod Shepherd will be held Saturday, May 7th at 1:00 PM at the United Church of Christ, 168 Bellevue Avenue, just off West Olive Street near the Terracina/Olive intersection in Redlands. He will be missed by his Native Sons brothers, friends, fellow political enthusiasts, and co-workers.

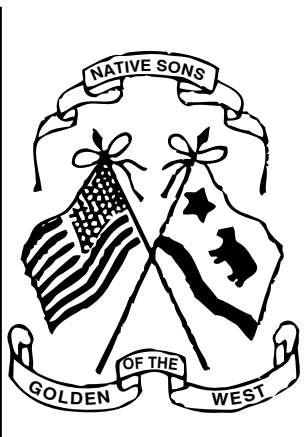
