

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Brethren,

“In Friendship, Loyalty, and Charity”. These are the watchwords of the Native Sons of the Golden West. The heartfelt concept of



“charity”, although the last placed of the three basic precepts of our order, is preeminent as it serves the community at large, and embraces especially those that are in need. The dedication of the Native Sons is no more apparent than our financial contributions to those that treat the devastating birth defect of cleft palate and related conditions at three hospitals in California: the University of California, San Francisco, Sutter Memorial Hospital, Sacramento and Saint John's Health Center, Santa Monica.

On Sunday, August 2nd, I viewed first hand at Saint John's Health Center the work and dedication of that hospital's team of physicians, nurses, support staff and the facilities that serve this great cause. Attending on behalf of the Grand Parlor were Eugene Perry, Grand President, Joe Ursino, Past Grand President and Chairman of the Charitable Foundation Board and Bob Leslie, Southern California Coordinator for the event. Other members of our Parlor, past and present, attending included: 1st Vice President Garry Devlin, Outside Sentinel Bill Rutherford, Financial Secretary PGP James Smith, Trustee Barbara Kimball and her husband PGP Richard Kimball, Dr. Katy Henry, Sherry Livingston and her mother Lucille. In addition, brothers from eight other Parlors, up and down the state, were present. They included Foundation Board members Bob Santos and his wife Kathy from Eden Parlor #113, and Stephen Faessel and his

wife Susan from Santa Ana Parlor #74.

Saint John's Cleft Palate Center has created a team dedicated to treat patients afflicted with cleft palate and craniofacial anomalies. The Center provides diagnostic, surgical, social and educational services to children and their families in a family centered environment, led by Janet Salmonson, M.D., Medical Director, Cleft Palate Center and the substantial contributions of Sister Marie Madeleine, Past President of Saint John's. Many others contribute, on a daily basis, energy and experience to the process of saving children from the devastating consequences of a life with an untreated cleft palate condition.

The day was filled with a detailed presentation by Dr. Salomonson of the genesis of the disease and the modern procedures to address and ultimately cure the condition. She stated that in the past, the condition was so devastating on the new born baby, that they would not survive in many cases. Now, with knowledge of the condition before birth, the chances of survival and a productive life without the disfigurement is a realistic goal.

At the end of her presentation, Dr. Salomonson introduced a young man with his family, now in his twenties, that had been born with cleft palate. Historical photos show a severe condition, but the young man introduced showed no sign of ever having such a devastating condition. He has a productive and normal life and is now attending junior college. That is what it is all about!

The festivities were highlighted by the presentation of a check in the amount of \$60,000 for use by the hospital for treatment of cleft palate. It was received with much


